OUR HISTORY

The lasting legacy of Martin "Kano" Kane

In 2008, Martin "Kano" Kane, a Glasgow man living in Australia, developed Devic's Syndrome. This rare immunological disorder left him hospitalised for months and in need specialised care.

Martin was a massive Celtic FC supporter and when other fans found out about his situation they quickly got together to help. The aim was to raise money to pay for modifications to Martin's house so he could get home to be with his family. In an amazing show of charity and generosity, the overall campaign exceeded the target!

It was decided to use the extra money to take a group of children, who had helped raise money during the campaign, to a match at Celtic Park. **The idea for The Kano Foundation was born.**

Martin sadly passed away in 2015 but The Kano Foundation lives on as a lasting legacy in his name.

HOW TO LEAVE A GIFT

Leaving a generous gift in your will can be a lot easier than you think. Here are some simple steps you can take to make sure your donation goes where you want it to.

There are several ways to help The Kano Foundation continue to bring kids to the game. The first step is to decide which of the below options would best suit you and your own specific plans.

RESIDUARY

The remainder of your estate once other gifts and payments have been made.

PECUNIARY

A fixed sum of money.

SPECFIC

A particular named item such as a property or other possession.



CONTACT A SOLICTOR

They will be able to help you write or update your will. Some solicitors provide free will writing and amendment services for charity. The cost will vary depending on the complexity of your circumstances and your solicitor.
